



Keynote Speaker – Professor Jan Goldman



Jan Goldman's career has spanned over 40 years working and teaching in the U.S. intelligence community. He is currently Professor of Intelligence and Security Studies at The Citadel, Military College of South Carolina. He has taught at numerous institutions, including the National Intelligence University, CIA University, and FBI Academy while organizing over a dozen international academic and professional intelligence conferences. He is the editor-in-chief of the highly respected International Journal of Intelligence and CounterIntelligence; the founding editor of professional textbooks – Security Professionals Intelligence Education Series (S.P.I.E.S., Bloomsbury Publishers); a member of several academic, research, and publishing advisory boards; founder of Experiential Learning Services, LLC; co-founder of the non-profit International Intelligence Ethics Association; founder and editor of the International Journal of Intelligence Ethics.

Dr. Goldman has published numerous articles and books to include Ethical Espionage: Ethics of the Intelligence Cycle; Intelligence and Information Policy for National Security: Key Terms and Concepts; The Central Intelligence Agency: An Encyclopedia of Covert Operations, Intelligence Gathering, and Spies (awarded Editors' Top Community College Resources and the Best Reference Title); and War on Terror Encyclopedia: From the Rise of Al Qaeda to 9/11 and Beyond.

He is an internationally recognized expert on the role of professional ethics in intelligence operations, and the only employee awarded "current and warning intelligence expert" at the Defense Intelligence Agency. He received his doctorate in education from George Washington University, graduate degrees from Georgetown University and Virginia Tech, and undergraduate degrees from the University of Texas.
